#### Internet of Things (IoT) and You

The alarm buzzes. It's 6 am, you are up and ready to welcome the new day. Your voice opens the shades of your room. The smart mirror in the bathroom tells you about the weather outside. Coffee starts brewing, lights start lighting up as you enter the kitchen. The display on your smart refrigerator shows you the possible breakfast recipes based on the groceries present inside the refrigerator and your diet. While you get ready, a device responds to your voice commands to read you your schedule & messages and turns on the TV to display the news. You hop into your car and drive to work on the least congested route suggested by it, making your morning perfect and stress free.

Seems like magic! Wouldn't you love to live in such a smart world?

All of this is possible because of a concept called the Internet of Things (IoT) which is

nothing but a network of devices or 'dumb objects' which talk to you and each other using the internet. By combining these web-enabled connected devices with automated systems, it is possible to 'gather information, analyze it, and create an action' to help someone with a particular task, or learn from a process.

IoT extends internet connectivity beyond standard devices such as desktops, laptops, and smartphones to include home appliances, wearables, energy consumption devices, security systems, transportation systems and much more.

Although IoT is still in its infancy because the products don't always easily connect to each other and there are some serious security and privacy concerns that need to be addressed but it's predicted by the experts that connected machines and objects in factories, called Industrial Internet of Things (IoT), will bring about a potential 'fourth industrial revolution'. By 2020, connected devices across all technologies will reach to about 20.6 billion. That's huge!

IoT has brought about a transformation in the supply chain and logistics industry as well. To give a practical example – Maersk, one of the biggest shipping companies in the world, partnered with Ericsson to install real-time monitoring across its entire fleet. This technology now allows Maersk's 3,00,000 refrigerated containers to transmit vital stats, such as temperature, location, and power supply via a satellite. The information is then sent to the cloud and analyzed in a central office.

Albeit a bit scary and unknown, the future with IoT seems fascinating and might potentially have a major impact on our lives, in the years to come.

# Bangladesh south Asia's greenest jewel – a country braided with rivers and rich

Bangaldesh being our immediate neighbour has not been explored as a destination for vacation as we feel that we share a same topography hence nothing different can be explored, I was intrigued by a country which was torn apart not just once but twice and survived two major massacres. It is home to the Sundarbans, the largest mangrove forest in the world. As you land in Dhaka there is a feeling of déjà vu. Everything looks familiar, People are swarming around. You can sense it's maddening chaos as you come out of the airport. People like in India are warm and helpful, Uber and Ola are easily available and life seems to be at ease but as you drive down the road the anarchy of a different kind hits you. You can be stranded on the road for hours altogether making you wonder if you will ever reach your destination. As your patience seems to be running out, you will be struck by the models of cars moving around you, as Bangladesh is a huge market for refurbished cars you can see some classic models of the yester years turning it into a nostalgic moment for sure.

Like Srilanka, Bangladesh is hub for garment manufacturing factories and it won't be long before it surpasses its counterpart. The manufacturing units have helped in empowering women to a great extent. Women cannot be seen on the roads or in the work place but gradually its changing as garment factories have made them the bread winners of the house. Bangla newspapers reported that the country had exported garments worth \$100 million for the 2018 World Cup, which was \$30 million up from the 2014 World Cup exports. In the 2018 Fifa World Cup, Bangladesh was present on and off the field as the sole supplier of all kits handed out to the Messis, Ronaldos, Neymars. Jerseys, socks, shorts and even the national flags of the participating countries bore the Made in Bangladesh tag

Chittagong port is country's largest and busiest port in the Bay of Bengal coastline. A hub for the cargo industry the government of Bangladesh is going all out to streamline the port operations and increasing the productivity by adapting to the new technologies.

People live a life of simplicity amongst poverty and struggles yet a country still in its youth is trying to reach for its place in the world. It's evident that the country is in hurry to make up for the lost time.

Though a small country but it is endowed with beautiful surrounding which makes it very attractive for the tourists around the world. Best places to visit in Bangladesh



Some interesting facts of Bangladesh.

- There are more than 2,000 periodicals and daily newspapers published in Bangladesh. However, the country's average constant readership is only at 15%.
- Bangladesh is sometimes called "the playground of seasons" because it has six not four separate seasons, which it calls grismo (summer), barsha (rainy), sharat (autumn), hemanto (cool), sheet (winter), and bashonto (spring).
- Bangladesh's oldest known city site is the city of Mahasthangarh.
- Bangladesh is home to the world's largest river delta and the world's largest mangrove.
- In Bangladesh, the left hand is considered unclean, so always use your right hand when eating or passing food, drinks – or business cards!
- The national anthem was written by Rabindranath Tagore.
- Bangladesh has a number of archaeological and historical sites dating back as far as the third century BC, but the frequent floods and the damp climate have destroyed much of the country's heritage.
- The people of Bangladesh seldom smile. This is not because they are unfriendly but because smiling much is considered a sign of immaturity.
- The area that is now Bangladesh has been settled for many thousands of years. There have been a series of ruling dynasties including the Buddhist Pala dynasty and the Hindu Sena dynasty. By the 12th century, Arab merchants had come to Bengal and the religion of Islam had begun to spread. In the 16th century, The Mughal Empire took control of Bengal and the city of Dhaka became an important center of the Mughal administration.

















