




Istanbul, a city within the two continents.

With one arm reaching out to Asia and the other to Europe, Istanbul is the only city in the world built on two continents. With a long and interesting history to look back, Turkey is an intriguing place to be. Istanbul is Turkey's most developed and largest city, with the latest discoveries indicating that the history of human habitation there goes back some 400,000 years. The purple years of Istanbul may have started in 330 when Emperor Constantine declared the city the capital of his empire – royal purple is the colour of the Byzantine imperial family. Until 1453, when it was conquered by the Ottomans, the city served as the capital of the Byzantine Empire. During the reign of the Byzantines, Istanbul was adorned with a number of great monuments, which made it the most magnificent city in the world, even during the declining years of the empire. Over the next 450 years, the city was adorned with superb Ottoman monuments. In Istanbul mosques, churches and synagogues stood and still stand side by side as the physical evidence of Istanbul and a symbol of tolerance and fraternity of religions.


The cool breeze and the clean beaches are the sights to behold. After becoming a European Capital of Culture in 2010 it has developed its contemporary cultural offer, with new museums including the Hilye-i Şerif and Prayer Beads Museum. The culture of Turkey is heavily diverse as it is a mix of Oriental and Western influences. Turkey is as an upper-middle income country; Istanbul is considered a newly industrialised city. It's a city rushing towards modernisation yet holding on to its traditional self.

The Turkish are highly emotional people and don't shy away from showing it too. Some 95 per cent of people prefers to have dinner with their families at home, indicating that family is still the most important element of Turkish society, despite changing lifestyles. Individualism is extremely low in Turkey, and the family is the main focus of life. The cuisine of Turkey has continued to evolve over centuries, deriving influence from its rich history of lands. The Turkish tea, coffee and Baklavas are famous world over. Bridging Asia and Europe both physically and culturally Istanbul is a city of fascinating contrasts and picturesque. A walk downtown promises unforgettable sights and a photo camera seems mandatory. The most significant ones that cannot be missed are, The Grand Bazaar in Istanbul, it's one of the largest and oldest covered markets in the world, with 61 covered streets and over 3,000 shops which attract between 250,000 and 400,000 visitors daily and Hagia Sophia is a former Greek Orthodox patriarchal basilica (church), later an imperial mosque, and now a museum are foremost in must visit list.



Some etiquettes to keep in mind while visiting Turkey.

- Before eating the food in Turkey its common for the chef and others at the table to wish each other 'afiyet olsun', which is essentially the same as saying Bon apatite. As a compliment to the chef, the diners at the table will also say 'elinize saglik', which literally means 'health to your hands' but is interpreted as a sign of endearment or 'very delicious, well done'.
- Finally, before drinking, everyone will shout 'serefe', meaning cheers! Turks are zealous hand shakers, so be prepared for enthusiastic greetings. Remember to offer the right hand only, as the left hand is considered unclean.
- Maintain direct eye contact when you can, as this is what is often expected and appreciated. There may be cases when women will avoid having direct eye contact with men.
- In business conversations, a little small talk is usually expected and appreciated before going into the issues at hand.
- To decline an offer, people often just put their hand onto their heart.
- When visiting homes, removing your shoes are commonly expected. When you sit down and cross your legs by putting your ankle of one leg on the knee of the other, make sure that the bottom of your foot is not pointing towards another person.
- Observant Muslims cannot eat, drink, or smoke between sunrise and sunset during Ramadan. Refrain from eating, drinking or smoking on the street out of respect, certainly in conservative areas such as Fatih.






